On June 1st we celebrated the 5th Anniversary of launching the IMPACT Ministry. During our year-end celebration in June we had the opportunity to hear from and honor our Founders and our Pioneers who answered God's call on their lives and worked to establish IMPACT.

### In the last 5 years...

- 140 Participants completed at least one class
- 88 Volunteers served the IMPACT Family
- 53 IMPACT members received Life Coaching or Navigation
- 137 Churches & Community Partners served a meal
- **45** Life Skills classes were taught
- 108 kids were loved on by our Childcare team
- We were lovingly and intentionally hosted by 2 amazing Church Partners: Skyview Presbyterian and South Fellowship and were able to offer "Affirming Potential" at West Bowles Community and Centennial Covenant.
- Undaunted by Covid lockdowns; IMPACT offered a caring virtual community throughout the pandemic.

# **Renewed Treasures**

In August we will celebrate the 10th Anniversary of our community resale ministry, Renewed Treasures. We are so excited to formally celebrate the achievement with a Volunteer Appreciation Dinner on Thursday, August 18th following the Anniversary Sale week August 8th-13th.

The store has been a blessing to our community as numerous neighbors have been served through vouchers for clothing, housewares, and furniture. Since the store opened; 831 total needs have been met serving a total of 457 households. Since 2016 we've issued 1203 Total Vouchers for individuals within those homes.



**Renewed Treasures** started in an old hair salon with several community garage sales to get funding for its renovation. Today, loyal shoppers share frequently just how much they love how clean and inviting the store is as well as how the beautiful resale merchandise is so affordable.

The store has engaged over 100 Volunteers since opening and has been led by Volunteer Managers and recently paid part time and full time Managers who saw the store through an incredibly challenging time for small businesses facing pandemic restrictions and quarantines.
